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#### § 203-1. Statutory acceptance and authority.

The Town of Mount Washington hereby adopts and avails itself of the provisions of the statutes now in force in relation to truant children, habitual truants and absentees from school. In pursuance of the authority conferred thereby establishes this chapter.

#### § 203-2. Truant Officers; appointment; compensation; duties.

Truant Officers shall be appointed and their compensation fixed as provided by law whose duty it shall be to inquire into all violations of the Truant Laws and of the laws relating to compulsory education and to do all acts required of them by the laws of this commonwealth, to keep a full record of all their official acts and to make an annual report thereof to the School Committee, which shall publish the same within its own report.
